First Baptist Family,

It's hard to believe that summer is already here! Students have finished the school year, and Seniors have graduated. People are now planning or have already started going on their summer vacations, and all of us are looking forward to a little bit of a break. Still, the work of the church continues. That's why I want to let you know more about some of the good things we have planned for the month of June. Before I get to some of our upcoming events, however, I think it's necessary that we reflect on an absolutely wonderful month of May. Back on Sunday, May 11, our children led us in worship, and we all heard a great sermon by Emma. Our children read Scripture and wrote out and prayed their own prayers. It was a powerful service. One of them, Isaac, even came forward at the end of worship as a candidate for baptism. And his baptism is scheduled for Sunday, June 22. Then, on Sunday, May 18 we ordained the now Rev. Adrienne Osborne to Gospel Ministry, and at the end of that service, Deb Mitchell came forward to join the church by transfer of letter. Then, finally, on Sunday, May 25, we had our graduate recognition service, heard a great sermon by Ben, and commissioned our two mission teams before they left to go to Folly Beach and Charleston, SC. The fact is, we've had lots of really powerful services lately. We've had several tangible examples of the ways in which God is at work in and through First Baptist Bristol. And these signs of life, well, they need to be recognized and celebrated! All these good things have me thinking, though. That's why I'm doing an informal survey, and I need your help. Don't worry - it's just two questions. First, why is First Baptist Bristol the church for you? And second, when you invite other people to join you at church, what do you say to them? I want you to think about these two questions and share your answers with me. You can text them, email them, or share them with me face to face, but please let me know how you answer these two questions as soon as you get the chance. I was talking with a church consultant and clergy coach recently, and he told me that people are six times more likely to visit worship for the first time if they are invited by someone other than the pastor. SIX TIMES! So, what you tell people about this church and how you invite them matters. And the fact is, there is a lot of good things to tell about First Baptist Bristol, especially right now.

Like I mentioned, June also promises to be a great month in the life of the church, and we have lots of things planned for you and those you bring with you. On Sunday, June 1, we're going to have our monthly Family Breakfast and we'll later serve communion in worship. Then, on Sunday, June 8, we'll celebrate Pentecost. I invite you to wear either red or orange that day, and then after worship, we'll have a recep-

tion in Rosser Hall for Mark and Leigh as we celebrate their ministry with us before Leigh's retirement. On Sunday, June 15, we'll not only celebrate the fathers and father-like figures in the church, but we'll also have a Men's Choir to **lead the music.** In addition to special Sundays, we're also going to have some exciting things happening during the week throughout the month of June. On Friday, June 6, we'll welcome back our youth and adult mission teams, which is why I want to encourage you to join me in praying for them while they are gone. On Monday, June 9, our youth are going to start their Massive Monday activities. They are called Massive Mondays because these events will all be on Mondays, and they will be MASSIVE amounts of fun. You can find the full schedule on our church website, and if you have any questions, I encourage you to talk with Ben. We're also going to be doing VBS a little differently this year. Rather than having one week, we're going to split up VBS over four weeks with children meeting on Wednesday evenings for four weeks consecutively. So, beginning Wednesday, June 11 until Wednesday, July 2, we're going to host Vacation Bible School from 5:30-7:30 PM. Food will be included, of course. If you are interested in volunteering or signing up your children or grandchildren, please contact Emma. Adults, you aren't being left out of the fun, though. The reason we have changed the way we're doing VBS this year is because we're also going to have something for parents. Adrienne is going to be leading a book study on Woven: Nurturing a Faith Your Kid Doesn't Have to Heal From by Meredith Miller. The basic premise of the book is that Miller argues for parents to help their children form a resilient and flexible faith rooted in knowing and trusting God rather than them seeing God as an inflexible taskmaster and faith as noth-


