First Baptist Family,

First, on Sunday, May 4, we're going to have our monthly family breakfast at 9 AM in Rosser Hall. Chef Harold will be busy in the kitchen, so come enjoy a good meal and better fellowship before heading off to Sunday School. That day in worship we'll also take communion together. Then, on Sunday, May 11, we'll not only celebrate Mother's Day by honoring the mothers and mother-like figures in the church, but we'll be celebrating our Children's Ministry as well. That Sunday will be our Children's Sunday. Many of you will remember that we've done this the past two years when our children have led us in worship. Emma Vance will be preaching that Sunday. Sunday, May 18 also promises to be a special day in the life of the church as we will ordain Adrienne Osborne to Gospel Ministry in worship that day. What you may not know, however, is that she is interested in chaplaincy work, and ordination is a logical next step for her with these vocational goals. It has been an awfully long time since the church has ordained someone to Gospel Ministry, so it promises to be a special day not only for Adrienne but for the church as well. You don't want to miss it. Also, this month I'll be resuming FBB 101. We'll meet for 3 weeks during the Sunday School hour in Rosser Hall on May 4, 11, and 18. If you are a new member, a frequent visitor, or if you're a long time member who would like to learn more about the church, I invite you to join me as we look at what it means to be Baptist and the kind of Baptists we are here at FBB, the organization and structure of the church, and ways in which you can get more involved in the life of the church. Then, finally, on Sunday, May 25 we will have our Graduate Recognition Service. Ben will be preaching in this service. If you know of someone who is graduating, please let Terri and/or Niki know in the church office. We don't want anyone to be forgotten about or overlooked. As you can see, May promises to be a good, full month in the life of the church, and you won't want to miss everything that's happening. So, bring yourself and bring someone with

you. You'll be glad that you did.

It's hard to believe that it's already May! This year is flying by, Finally, I wanted to share a little bit about an event I attended recently. The event was about this Dinner Church movement, and it was sponsored by the Baptist General Association of Virginia (BGAV). While the information about this Dinner Church movement was interesting, what I found most interested was actually a quote from the main presenters - a pastor couple from Seattle. After talking about a multi-year period of church decline, the husband said that he and his wife met with the leadership of the church, and they began to have some difficult but much needed conversations. He said, "We realized that we were in the church business. We were in the programs business, in the building and property business, but that God is in the rescue business and that we needed to return to the family business. For us to return to the family business, however, we realized that we needed to think about things differently. We had to change the questions we asked ourselves. And for us, that changed everything."

> Frequently, I will mention programming events the church has planned. I'll encourage you to come yourself and to bring someone with you - not only have I already done that in this column, but I do it in practically every First Word article I write. What I'm realizing, however, is that I've not done a good enough job in connecting what we do as a church to God's larger rescue mission. The purpose of our programs and events is to introduce people or re-introduce people to the God of the universe. The reason we have a building isn't for ourselves, but so that we have a space to honor and worship God. Our various mission emphases, they aren't just to make people feel good about themselves – they are to give people opportunities to be Christ's hands and feet out in the world. The church isn't a building; it's a people. You and I, we are the church, and we need to shift the way we think about things. We need to think less about doing church and more about being church, realizing that we have the opportunity to partner with God in God's rescue mission. So, I want to encourage you not to think of the events we have planned this month as just one more thing to put on your to-do list, but to think of them as events that will empower you to join in God's rescue work. Sometimes a new perspective is exactly what we need in order to see just how much God is at work amongst us.
