First Baptist Family,

October always proves to be a busy month in the life of the church, and this year is no different. While we have a lot going on this month, there are a few things I want to bring to your attention. First, as many of you will remember, October is Stewardship Month at First Baptist Bristol. Each week in worship we're going to have a Stewardship Moment, and in these moments, you'll hear more about how your gifts of time, talent, and treasure go to support the missions and ministries of this church. You'll hear more about how your gifts help maintain the facilities of the church, how they enable us to have strong children, youth, and music programs, how they enable us to have meaningful discipleship ministries, and how they help us be the hands and feet of Christ in this community and in this world through the numerous missions and missionaries we support. Simply put, we as a church can't function without you and your willingness to give. So, to highlight the participatory nature of stewardship, you're going to have several ways in which you can respond. We'll have pledge cards again this year, and we will have two of them. One card will be for financial pledges, and the other will be for pledges of time and service. You will still be able to make your financial pledges on Realm, as well. Everything will culminate at the end of the month.

We'll have Consecration Sunday on Sunday, October 27. During that service, we'll have a time in which you will be able to walk forward and place your pledges (both financial and time pledges) in the church replica we use every year (we will not livestream this portion of the service). After worship that Sunday, we'll have our Quarterly Business Meeting. And since October is also Minister Appreciation Month, the Board of Administration is organizing a Staff Appreciation Luncheon immediately following the business meeting in Rosser Hall. We'll have spaghetti, garlic bread, salad, and dessert for lunch. While there is no cost for the meal, donations are encouraged. We'll have a donation basket on the table near the entrance to Rosser Hall. And there will be little notecards where you can share words of encouragement with the staff. Finally, on October 27, we're going to have our Fall Festival from 4-6 PM that afternoon and evening. All that to say, October 27 will be a good, full day in the life of the church.

Also in October, I'm going to be resuming FBB 101. We'll meet for 3 weeks during the Sunday School hour in Rosser Hall on October 6, October 20, and October 27. If you are a new member, a frequent visitor, or if you're a long time member who would like to learn more about the church, I invite you to join me as we look at what it means to be Baptist and the kind of Baptists we are here at FBB, the organization and structure of the church, and ways in which you can get more involved in the life of the church. As a reminder, if you are unable to make one of these sessions, I will be leading it again in January. I lead this study the first month of each quarter minus July.

Finally, we're going to finish the church calendar year in prayer. You should have already received a separate email from me about this, but in case you haven't, beginning on Wednesday, October 16 we're going to start 40 Days of Prayer for Unity. Like Lent, this is going to be for 40 days not counting Sundays, but from Wednesday, October 16 to Saturday, November 30 we're going to have a prayer calendar in which we are all invited to pray for the same thing each day. Each day will contain a different prompt or item to pray for, excluding Sundays which will have the same prompt each week. The calendar goes to Saturday, November 30 because Sunday, December 1 is the beginning of Advent, which serves as the beginning of a new year for the church. So, I hope you'll join me in finishing out the church calendar year in praying for unity for our church, our community, our country, and our world. I think that you'll be glad that you did.

It's a great time to be at First Baptist Bristol. We have lots of great things going on, so I encourage you to commit yourself to being here regularly. Be a good steward of the time, talent, and treasure that God has given you, and look for ways to use them here. Join in as we all seek to grow God's Kingdom from the corner of State and Sedgefield Streets. Not only will you be blessed, but you'll have the opportunity to bless someone else, too.


Christmas rehearsals have begun for our annual cantata. You are officially invited to join us for rehearsals on Wednesday evenings. We begin at 7 with an
